Linda O'Toole gave an excellent talk about **Photography** and tips on the best way to photograph floral art. She illustrated her talk with photographs of her work and techniques.

The session on **Speaking** was led by Janneke Jones, the Area Speakers' Representative, who encouraged Clubs to have a Speaker at their



meetings and also gave guidance on 'How to give a Vote of Thanks.'

The day ended with **a Demonstration** by Jane Ellis, our Demonstrators' Representative who illustrated some of the Principles and Elements of Design in three arrangements.

Leigh-on-Sea Floral Group Sharing the Seasonal Joy!

Leigh Floral Group has been active since 1950 and continues to flourish. Like clubs across the UK, our membership age range is 'mature', most are accomplished flower arrangers who enjoy watching enchanting demonstrations and occasional workshops which help those of us with less well-honed skills to learn and improve!

With an excellent calendar of events our club is growing stronger. Local press provides free advertising and shares information about our events. In 2023, together with monthly club nights, we held an unwanted Christmas gift sale, 2 coffee mornings, a plant sale, a club lunch and capped the year off when Linda Kingcott (our NAFAS Qualified Demonstrator) led a Festive Wreath workshop that was greatly enjoyed and attracted support from outside our membership.



Our November club night included our popular annual hamper raffle and our annual 'decorate a gift for a homeless person' competition. In and around Leigh there is strong charitable support for the homeless and those living with addiction and poverty. Annually our club members each buy a gift – a food item, hygiene products or thick socks, hats and gloves. The donors festively wrap each item and at our club meeting members vote for the most imaginatively wrapped gift. Its donor receives a small prize for their efforts! The gifts are then delivered in December to 'HARP' (our largest local organisation in this sector). Centre managers were overjoyed!

At monthly club nights we ask members for a small (unspecified) donation for refreshments. 50% of the donations are added to club funds and 50% are saved for our club charity of the year. At Christmas most club members forego sending cards within the club, instead donating money for our club charity. Since 2020 that charity has been HARP. During lockdowns we could not raise any money, but in 2022/3 we raised £225 for HARP, delivering the cheque with the gifts.

Our charity for 2024/5 will be Southend Hospital's Spotlight Radiotherapy Appeal, raising funds to buy new machines to make treatments for head and neck cancers less unpleasant. We will continue our festive gifts to HARP too! Thus, our group is affiliated to and supports NAFAS but also provides charitable support close to home.

Like all clubs, our committee is dwindling but we ably cover all the jobs that need doing – and whilst we can, we will continue in this way. It is difficult to attend Area events in the northwest of the Home Counties Area; the journey round the M25 is arduous and high fuel costs are prohibitive. But we are a strong club, with a great membership, local support and a willingness to try new things and spread the joy of our floral arrangement adventures!

FLORAL ARTIST VISIT FROM PAKISTAN

I received a phone call from Shaista Khawar who was visiting her brother in Hemel Hempstead where Stoneycroft Flower Club is based. She had been the President of the Floral Art Society of Pakistan, Rose Chapter, Lahore from 2020 -2022. By background she is a Floral Artist, SOGETSU IKEBANA teacher and Garden Landscaper. She is currently advisor to her Flower Club in Lahore.



Shaista wanted to visit our club and to make connections with other clubs in the area while she was here for 3-4 weeks. Shaista came in November to a workshop at Stoneycroft and led a small demonstration on wire work after the main workshop. Using Power Point, she gave a teaching presentation on her floral designs and other work in Pakistan. This included an amazing number of large installations using a variety of materials including flowers for the entrances and displays at large horticultural events throughout Pakistan. The photograph is of Shaista receiving an award from the Governor of the Punjab, Mr. Muhammad Ur Rehman at Governor House, Lahore for the Jilani Park Chrysanthemum Show.

Our club had a November trip to Savin Wholesalers and a nearby Garden Centre on which Shaista accompanied us. It was an amazing experience for her. These types of outlets are not available in Pakistan with Christmas displays and a huge variety of flower arranging materials. Fitting all her purchases into the minibus was quite a challenge.

We helped to connect Shaista with a few other local clubs. Also, with the London & Overseas Area, enabling her to attend the London & Overseas Annual General Meeting in a Central London Hotel. She was delighted to renew her acquaintance with Valerie Best whom she had met through WAFA and to make new friends. These included Gill McGregor who was demonstrating at the West Herts Flower Club Open Evening in Hemel Hempstead a week later. We had arranged to take Shaista along with our club members. She was able to go on stage for a photo opportunity with Gill. The visit revolved around making new friends, sharing knowledge and gaining insight into how we share the joy of flower arranging. Fun, Friendship and Flowers are a common denominator crossing continents, wherever we meet up together with likeminded individuals.

HOW TO ENCOURAGE PRACTICAL WORK IN CLUBS – SOME IDEAS

These ideas will assist both individual participation and social interaction; encouraging members through our enthusiasm to firstly enjoy workshops or dabble evenings and to have a go at simple competition work and then to try at a club show. This will hopefully lead on to shows at Area and then National level.

All these shows are ways that we can inform members of the public about our work and possibly encourage them to join a club. It is then up to us to be welcoming and to start the process of active participation all over again.

1 At a club meeting set a simple title for a class and ask members to bring an arrangement they have done and ask members to place a coin eg 5p or more next to the one they like most. (This money could then go to club funds) An experienced member would then state some positive points about each one.

2 Another idea is to record, on each occasion a class is staged, who had the most coins, the second most and third most. The person with the most coins over a year could be presented with a prize. A class could be staged on alternate months.

3 Choose some titles that encourage the use of garden plant material if appropriate.

4 Possibly have 2 classes, one for the experienced and one for novices, so that each feel comfortable and not intimidated.

5 After a time have a competition night rather than a demonstrator with possibly 3 classes and make it a social evening.

6 The Area could set a title on one occasion for all clubs to each have a competition and the winner from each one to come to a council meeting and set up their designs and the best one given a prize.

Unless all of us show enthusiasm and encouragement to all members to participate actively we shall die as an organisation.

On a personal note I must admit going to an Area show as a first time exhibitor, yes, it is a brave step but one worth taking as I learned so much from seeing how others worked and talking to more experienced competitors. Later this also occurred when attempting my first national. I also made friends from around the country with whom I still keep in contact.

Flowers do certainly help develop friendship and fun.
